Rainforest Trust helps create and manage new protected areas across the tropics and subtropics, mainly focused on:


- Central and South America
- Asia
- Africa

We focus on establishing protected areas in unprotected Key Biodiversity Areas home to significant populations of Critically Endangered and Endangered species. We use global databases including KBA, IUCN Red List and the IUCN World Database for Protected Areas to prioritize where we work.
